

Advent is incredibly important. The children need to know that we are entering a period expectant waiting and of preparation. Yes, it is a very exciting time and the children will be looking forward to all the festivities, but they also need to know the real meaning of Christmas. We are preparing for the birth of baby Jesus. This is why we decorate our homes and school, and prepare ourselves for this special day.

Advent Preparation Day: Friday 25th November:

On this day the children will spend the time preparing for the start of Advent.

Activities on this day may include:

- Making Christmas decorations to prepare the classrooms
- Class and individual Advent Calendars
- Writing Advent Prayers

As always, the Friends of St Winifred's have sourced donations of Christmas Trees for our school hall and reception area.



Posada- Travelling Crib:

Posada is an old Mexican tradition where young people dressed as Mary and Joseph travelled from home to home asking for a room for a night and telling people about the imminent arrival of Jesus in the weeks leading up to Christmas. On Christmas Eve they would visit the local church to re-enact the nativity and place figures of Mary and Joseph in a crib.

Modern day Posadas use nativity figures of Mary, Joseph and the Donkey, who travel from place to place. This gives each 'host' the chance to create their own celebration in their home, worshipping and reaching out to families with the real message of Christmas.

Every day, a child in each class will be chosen to 'host' Mary and Joseph. That evening, the children will take home the Posada bag and they can choose what activities to do with them.

The Posada Bag includes:

- Figures of Mary, Joseph and the donkey
- A Story book of the Nativity
- A Class Posada reflection book
- Laminated information sheets / suggested activities



In this Class reflection book the children need to record their experience, it may be that they choose to write a diary entry, re-tell the nativity story, write a prayer/ reflection and/or draw a picture. The children may even wish to include photographs of themselves with the figurines.

The next morning the children return the Posada bag to school so that their experience can be shared with the class and passed on to the next family.

Christmas Fair: Thursday 15th December


The Friends of St Winifred's Christmas Fair will be held on the 15th December straight after school pick up from 3-5.30pm.
