Safety:

Year 5 and 6 children, when requested by parents and carers, are granted permission to come to and from school by themselves. This acts as a good preparation for secondary school, when children are trusted to be more responsible. If you have a child in Year 5 and 6, please remember the main gate does not open until 8:30am. Please, check what time they leave home, so that they do not arrive to school too early. Permission is **only** given to those children in years 5 and 6, if they have younger siblings, they should not be bringing them to school. A 10 or 11-year-old child, should not be responsible for a younger sibling, it's not safe. Please ensure that all other children are safely escorted to the school gates.

Parish Carol Concert:

As I said last week, on Sunday 5th December, at 3:30pm, the Year 4, 5 and 6 pupils have been asked to perform at the Carol Concert in Our Lady of Lourdes parish. Currently we have 13 pupils who are willing to attend. In order to perform as a choir and for their voices to fill the church, we would ideally need 20. I really want to re-establish our links with the parish and would love to watch our children perform. Are there any more volunteers? Please return the permission slip if you would like your child to participate. If you are free on this Sunday afternoon, why don't you join us for this joyful event during Advent.

Mini Vinnies Advent Appeal:

The Mini Vinnies, made up of children from Years 5 and 6, have put out an Advent plea. Mini Vinnies are the junior section of the Catholic organisation of the St Vincent de Paul Society, which exists to help those in need. They want to help people in need during the cold winter months and have come up with the idea of a back to front advent calendar.

They are asking each class to create their own Advent Calendar for a good cause. Rather than opening a calendar door each day and removing the gift, they are requesting that a gift is donated instead. Each class will have a box to collect their donations. The children will collect all the items at the end of term and take them to the Lewisham Donation Hub.



The kinds of things that can be donated include unopened body moisturiser (especially emollient 50), adult and baby shampoo, hair conditioner, toothpaste and toothbrushes (child and adults), perfume and after shave, deodorant (men's and women's), mouthwash, shaving foam, razors, talcum powder. Tinned tomatoes, noodles, UHT milk, pasta, rice, tinned soups, chick peas, cereal, tuna and mackerel (tins), couscous, pasta sauce, Indian sauce, lentils, coconut milk, stock cubes, crisps and treats, orange squash (and similar), flour, breakfast bars, coffee, tea.



First Holy Communion and Reconciliation Preparation 2021-22:

This year, Our Lady of Lourdes Parish, Lee will run their First Holy Communion programme here at St Winifred's Catholic Primary School, rather than meeting in the Church. This will take place on Wednesdays or Thursdays (depending on the number who enrol) after school. Reception 2022:



Covid-19 Guidance

We are in the season of the common cold. Lot of us will develop coughs, which in the past we would not have been worried by. However, due to the pandemic, all new, continuous coughs need to be treated as potential Covid-19. I know that it is incredibly frustrating when a child has to be off, when you're sure it's 'just' a cold.

The guidance is very clear, the main symptoms of COVID-19 are:

- a high temperature
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot, for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours
- a loss or change to sense of smell or taste this means they cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

If any one in the school develops any of these symptoms, child or adult, they are sent home and must have a PCR. Thank you for you understanding, we know it is not ideal.

Spare clothing for accidents

Thank you for bringing in your outgrown uniform, but we are very short of aged 6/7 and 8 underwear for minor 'accidents'. Also socks and tights for the wet weather 'accidents'. If you are able to donate any of these items we will be very appreciative.
