Cake Sale for Gaza

Next Thursday there will be a cake sale to raise money for the charity MAP, Medical Aid for Palestinians. Our Lady of Lourdes church have already raised funds to help and the school is following suit.

Since the beginning of this latest conflict, nearly 1.7 million people have had to leave their homes in Gaza. That's over half of the population. Over 200,000 housing units have been damaged or destroyed, roughly 45% of all homes in Gaza. More than 15,000 people have been killed, 70% of which are women and children. Over 34,000 children have been injured and more than 6000 people are missing in Gaza. Hospitals, schools, mosques and churches have been destroyed.

The humanitarian need is great, so the Mini Vinnies are helping several parents to run a cake sale to raise funds for MAP.

So, next Thursday, please help where you can. Bring in cakes to sell and leave them by the gate in the morning and / or a £1 to buy cakes after school.

We also had an assembly by the Mini Vinnies. The Mini Vinnies are made up of children from Years 5 and 6. The children prepared it all themselves. They have created an Advent calendar of good deeds, where all the children are encouraged to do something positive every day of advent.

Mini Vinnies are the junior section of the Catholic organisation of the St Vincent de Paul Society, which exists to help those in need. They want to help people in need during the cold winter months and have come up with the idea of a back to front advent calendar.



They also have put out an Advent plea. They are asking each class to create their own Advent Calendar for a good cause. Rather than opening a calendar door each day and removing the gift, they are requesting that a gift is donated instead. Each class will have a box to collect their donations. The children will collect all the items at the end of term and take them to the Lewisham Donation Hub.

The kinds of things that can be donated include unopened body moisturiser (especially emollient 50), adult and baby shampoo, hair conditioner, toothpaste and toothbrushes (child and adults), perfume and after shave, deodorant (men's and women's), mouthwash, shaving foam, razors, talcum powder. Tinned tomatoes, noodles, UHT milk, pasta, rice, tinned soups, chick peas, cereal, tuna and mackerel (tins), couscous, pasta sauce, Indian sauce, lentils, coconut milk, stock cubes, crisps and treats, orange squash (and similar), flour, breakfast bars, coffee, tea.

St Winifred's in the Football Final!

A message from Mr Dickerson, our PE lead:


