Christmas Hampers

Family Hampers

I'd like to thank all the volunteers, who created 23 Christmas hampers for families within our school. The hampers were thoughtfully put together with Christmas treats and specific gifts for the children in those families. The volunteers do this annually and anonymously. So, on behalf of the school and those families who received such thoughtful hampers, thank you ever so much.

Festive Hamper Bags

Just before the Christmas holidays, Karen McLaren (one of our parent governors) of Virtual Executive Support and in partnership with Sci4Us, used our school to prepare 168 festive hamper bags. On the day the goods were delivered to school, there were so many items that two vans were needed and we had to enlist the Year 6 children to help us move it all from the reception area!

This initiative aims to address period poverty and dental health, and encourage enthusiasm for Science by providing children STEM (Science, Technology,

Engineering and Maths) kits to use at home. They also included some football boots, clothes, hats, and bags to enrich these hampers further. These additions, together with the essential food items, reflected the collaborative effort of all their partners. 30 of these hampers were given to St Winifred's to distribute them to families from the school. The other bags were shared at local schools, reaching the wider community in Lewisham and in neighbouring boroughs.

A huge thank you to Karen McLaren and her colleagues for including us in this initiative. We were able to distribute all the hampers and they were very gratefully received.

Class Assemblies

As always, you are invited to attend your child's class assembly. This term we are going to trial a new time for Early Years and KS1 assemblies. These assemblies will be at 2:45pm on Thursdays. The rationale behind this change is that we have observed that many of our younger children become very upset when saying goodbye to their parents/carers after the morning assembly. Our aim, by having it at the end of the day, is that they will not have to say goodbye, they will be able to go home with the adult who has come to watch.

Therefore, if you are coming to a KS2 assembly, you may enter through the main gate and wait under the canopy after bringing your child to school in the morning. At 8:45am you will then be invited into the main hall for an 8:50am start. If you are attending an assembly in the afternoon, you will come through the main reception and be escorted to the hall for the 2:45pm start.

Swimming:

Being able to swim is a vital life skill and due to this, it is on the curriculum. This year we have managed to book into the Glass Mill in Lewisham. Like last year, the lessons will be delivered in intensive blocks, as they are more effective. Last year we really saw our non-swimmers swimming by the end of the 2 weeks. These blocks consist of 10 consecutive hourly lessons, over two weeks. The children in Year 4 will go swimming in the spring term and Year 5 will go in the summer term in the afternoon. Parents/carers will receive letters regarding their child's swimming lessons a few weeks before their block of lessons commence.


