If parents need two separate appointments, please contact the office, as the system does not allow two bookings to be made for one child. I have fed this back to the company, as something which could be improved.

You can make an appointment for a 10-minute discussion with your child's teacher, in your child's classroom. You will also be able to spend time looking at your child's work before your appointment if you arrive a bit earlier. In order to ensure you don't have to wait, teachers will use timers. It is really important that appointments do not overrun but if you need more time then you are welcome to arrange a follow up meeting.

### **Art Exhibition:**



The children's art work is to be exhibited in the main hall after school during the parent evenings on Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> and Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> February. This year's theme is: Shape and Form. We are hoping that when you come to school to attend the meeting with your class teacher, that you take some time to go and see the children's art in the hall. Please feel free to drop into the hall after school on these days.

#### **Coffee Mornings:**

Don't forget our weekly coffee mornings! All are welcome. These will be held every Thursday morning. On a Thursday, once you have dropped your child to school, come in to the small hall and have a cup of tea or coffee and a biscuit with other parents. Thank you to all the parents who attended this week. This week we explored having themes for each Thursday, in order to discuss common issues being faced by parents. Some of the suggested themes were: screen-time / internet safety, SEND, housing etc. Next week's theme will be housing. We look forward to seeing you there.

#### **Class Assemblies**

As always, you are invited to attend your child's class assembly. This term we are going to trial a new time for Early Years and KS1 assemblies. These assemblies will be at 2:45pm on Thursdays. The rationale behind this change is that we have observed that many of our younger children become very upset when saying goodbye to their parents/carers after the morning assembly. Our aim, by having it at the end of the day, is that they will not have to say goodbye, they will be able to go home with the adult who has come to watch.

Therefore, if you are coming to a KS2 assembly, you may enter through the main gate and wait under the canopy after bringing your child to school in the morning. At 8:45am you will then be invited into the main hall for an 8:50am start. If you are attending an assembly in the afternoon, you will come through the main reception and be escorted to the hall for the 2:45pm start.


