Housing Issues / Skills



In our coffee morning last week, I shared various situations some members of our school community were facing in regards to their housing. We discussed what support could be provided by the council but also what we could do to

offer support and help. We thought about the impact this is having on the children's physical and mental health. What impact is it having on their education? Despite some awful living conditions, the children still come to school and try their best. It was suggested that I ask for the goodwill of parents / carers, who may be able to donate their time and skills to help members of our community.

As part of our work with Citizens UK, local schools and community we have been talking about housing issues that members of our communities are facing. As there is going to be a by-election on March 7th, we thought we could put pressure on the council to make housing a top priority. On Friday 1st of March, some children from St Winifred's and from other local schools will be holding an assembly at Rushey Green Primary. Brenda Dacres, the Labour candidate will be in attendance. The children will share housing issues known to school communities and will put questions to Ms Dacres, in the hope that she listens to the needs of the community she may be serving. The assembly will then march to Lewisham Town Hall in Catford.

Yesterday evening, I sent a School Ping with a form attached in order to gather information. I'm asking parents to share what skills they have to offer. I am also asking parents in rented accommodation to share the issues their facing. If you would like to be involved in the campaign please also indicate it on the form.

Class Assemblies

As always, you are invited to attend your child's class assembly. This term we are going to trial a new time for Early Years and KS1 assemblies. These assemblies will be at 2:45pm on Thursdays. The rationale behind this change is that we have



observed that many of our younger children become very upset when saying goodbye to their parents/carers after the morning assembly. Our aim, by having it at the end of the day, is that they will not have to say goodbye, they will be able to go home with the adult who has come to watch.

Therefore, if you are coming to a KS2 assembly, you may enter through the main gate and wait under the canopy after bringing your child to school in the morning. At 8:45am you will then be invited into the main hall for an 8:50am start. If you are attending an assembly in the afternoon, you will come through the main reception and be escorted to the hall for the 2:45pm start.


