NEU Industrial Action

As explained in my letter yesterday, on **Thursday 2nd March** the school will be closed to most classes, due to industrial action. Mary Class (Rec), St Veronica (Yr2), St Bernadette (Yr3) and St Josephine (Yr5) will be open as usual.

<u>Absence Clarification</u>: Many of you have queried why the strike has been recorded as an absence. We use various codes when reporting absence. The code we used for the strike, does not affect their overall absence percentage, as it is not counted as a possible attendance. <u>If your child's class is open and your child does not attend, their absence will be recorded following normal procedures.</u>

<u>Planned Events</u>: As many of you have highlighted to me, there are assemblies, trips, swimming planned on the proposed dates. As you know, our celebration of World Book Day has been moved to the day before, on Wednesday 1st March. As to events that are specific for just one or two classes, until we know if the particular teacher is striking. or not, I cannot cancel or rearrange. As soon as I do know, I will.


