Schools Street- Driving to School



As you all know, Newstead Road is a School Street. The School Street restricts vehicles without an exemption from entering Newstead Road from its junction with Parkcroft Road to Birch Grove and whole length of Birch Grove.

The timed restriction is in place from 8:15-9:15am and 2:45-3:45pm and restricts access to all vehicles, except those with an exemption permit, during the times of enforcement. Enforcement is carried out Monday to Friday, term time only.

Many parents/carers rely on parking in Kimbolton Close. Unfortunately, many of our parent/carers have been exceeding the speed limit on the estate, blocking residents' drives and parking dangerously. This has caused many of our neighbours to make complaints to the school and to their housing association.

I know that some families have long journeys and are under time pressures, however, safety of pedestrians, particularly our children is paramount. My understanding is that there has been some speeding, which has resulted in near misses. Additionally, the school needs to be a good neighbour. The school must have positive relationships with local residents. I know that this does not apply to everyone, but if it does, please be mindful at these times of the day.

Housing Issues / Skills

CITIZENS In our coffee morning before half term, I shared various situations some members of our school community were facing in regards to their housing. We discussed what support could be provided by the council but also what we could do to offer support and help. We thought about the

support could be provided by the council but also what we could do to offer support and help. We thought about the impact this is having on the children's physical and mental health. What impact is it having on their education? Despite some awful living conditions, the children still come to school and try their best. It was suggested that I ask for the goodwill of parents / carers, who may be able to donate their time and skills to help members of our community.

As part of our work with Citizens UK, local schools and community we have been talking about housing issues that members of our communities are facing. As there is going to be a by-election on March 7th, we thought we could put pressure on the council to make housing a top priority. On Friday 1st of March, some children from St Winifred's and from other local schools will be holding an assembly at Rushey Green Primary. Brenda Dacres, the Labour candidate will be in attendance. The children will share housing issues known to school communities and will put questions to Ms Dacres, in the hope that she listens to the needs of the community she may be serving. The assembly will then march to Lewisham Town Hall in Catford.

We will be hosting a series of open days this term. If you would like to book a place on one of the open days, please contact the school office. Please feel free to share this information with prospective parents you may know.


