The Way of the Cross

Every class from Nursery to Year 6, has been allocated a station of the cross. Each class has been asked to explore this station and what it means. The children have been asked to represent the station creatively. The



children can represent the station in any way they wish, for example through photography, natural materials or painting. They could also add words, phrases and prayers. There is no expected way to create the station, it is open to their interpretation, which means there will be 15 different ideas displayed in 15 distinctive ways.

The artwork has been displayed in designated communal areas of the school in preparation for next week. Each class will be given a time slot over during Holy Week, in which to walk the way of the cross, stopping and looking at each station and how the children across the school have depicted the stations.

Parents and carers are invited to come and walk the stations on Thursday 28th March between 1:30pm and 3:15pm. The Year 6 children will guide you around the stations, this will take approximately 30 minutes. If you would like to join us, please use the booking form which will be sent via School Ping. We look forward to seeing you there.

We will be hosting a series of open days this term. If you would like to book a place on one of the open days, please contact the school office. Please feel free to share this information with prospective parents you may know.






The Bad Guys!!!!

There is a sad part at the end where there is a baby parade and the biological father of the baby said he would stop by, but at the last minute he said he would be late to her mum's house.


Eventually, Kristy realises that she has got a perfect father right here.
