### **Holy Week**

Next week will be the school's Holy Week. We will take time every day with the children to stop and reflect on the Lord's Passion in the most important time of our liturgical year.

Every class Reception to Year 6, has been allocated a station of the cross. Each class has been asked to explore this station and what it means. Then the children have been asked to represent the station creatively. The children can represent the station in any way they wish, for example through photography, natural materials or painting. They could add words, phrases and prayers if you wish to. There is no expected way to create the station, it is open to their interpretation, which means there will be 14 different ideas displayed in 14 distinctive ways.



The art work will be displayed in designated communal areas of the school. Once installed, each class will be given a time slot, in which to walk the way of the cross, stopping and looking at each station and how the children across the school have depicted the stations.

On Friday 1st April, we will celebrate Easter in school with the Easter egg hunt and other lovely activities.

## <u>Little Wandle: Letters and Sounds Revised Meeting: Tuesday 29<sup>th</sup> March 9:30am</u>



Parents of children in Early Years and KS1 are invited to a meeting about <u>Little Wandle, Letters and Sounds Revised</u>, our new phonics programme. Our aim is to explain how the system works and how best to support the children at home with their phonics learning. ### **Parent Governor Elections**

After Easter, I will be writing to you to invite you to stand for election as a parent governor, or nominate another parent to do so. In our school we have provision for two parent governors and there is currently one vacancy.

The governing body, with the headteacher, has overall responsibility for the running of the school. Governing bodies have three core strategic functions:

- Ensuring clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction;
- Holding the headteacher to account for the educational performance of the school and its pupils; and
- Overseeing the financial performance of the school and making sure its money is well spent.

No special qualifications are needed and the most important thing is to have a keen interest in the school and be prepared to play an active part in the governing body's work. However, we would particularly welcome nominations from parents with skills in finance. Training is available for all governors and this governing body has an expectation that those new to being a governor, attend free induction training. Please use this time to think about whether you would like to stand for election after the Easter holidays and look out for the email with all the information after the holidays.

## **Covid Update**

As you know, all Covid restrictions have been removed by the government and there is no legal need to isolate now after a positive test. The guidance states "Stay at home if you can and avoid contact with other people". Therefore, as a school we are remaining cautious and are asking children and staff, who test positive, to stay at home. We ask that if anyone tests positive that they do not return to school until they have had two negative lateral flows tests, 24hours apart from day 5. We are maintaining this in place until Easter, as we do have vulnerable members of our community, that we would like to keep safe.

If you have registered interest for a full-time or part-time Nursery place in September 2022, you should have received the application pack. This will be for children who were born between 1<sup>st</sup> September 2018 and 31<sup>st</sup> August 2019. We will be hosting a series of open days this half term. If you would like to book a place on one of the open days, please contact the school office. Please feel free to share this information with prospective parents you may know.



If you think you may be entitled to the 30 hours provision you should apply for an eligibility code at <a href="https://www.gov.uk/apply-30-hours-free-childcare">https://www.gov.uk/apply-30-hours-free-childcare</a>.

The Application Form, the Supplementary Form and proof of baptism need to be returned to the school on or before 1<sup>st</sup> April 2022.
