Thank you to all who attended the AGM on Tuesday evening. It was our great pleasure to present Miss Hanrahan with a cheque for £10,700 which would not have been possible without the support of parents and friends of the school as well as our local businesses.

(Link: <http://www.swcps.lewisham.sch.uk/friendssnewsletter/>) but we wanted to give a quick flavour of how the money has been spent to benefit all our children: an artist to work with children to create the wonderful recycled plastic art installation in the main hall; equipment for the sensory room and playground in the early years block; new benches for the hall and playground; resources to support the school including workshops; books, instruments, sports kit and new animal houses as well as treats for the children. Money raised has further been used to enable to refresh the peace garden which is an oasis of calm for the children.
