#### **Dear Parents and Carers,**

I would like to thank all of you who took the time to attend the Zoom 'Meet the New Head Teacher Meetings'. It was very strange to speak to you all in that way, but I hope that you all found it beneficial. I definitely found it to be a positive experience. Many questions were asked and it did raise issues that need to be addressed. I will be working on them and will notify you all as things are put into place.

I met with Father Emeka this week to discuss re-establishing the school's links to the parish. As you are all aware, due to Covid, the school's involvement in the parish was stopped. 


### Year 6 Leavers' Mass

# Punctuality:

As you all know, I am incredibly keen for all of our children to be in class, ready to learn at 8:45am. The gates are open from 8:30am. As you are all aware, at 8:45am, I am ringing the school bell and then closing the gate. I use a digital watch, which is accurate, to ensure the bell is rung precisely at 8:45am. My intention is not to upset the children and parents / carers, my aim is to stress how vital it is to be on time. I spoke about it this week in my meetings with you all and I discussed it with the children in our whole school assembly, being late regularly equates to lost learning time. If you arrive once the gate has closed, you will be asked to escort your child to the school office. May I please remind parents / carers that the ladies in the office are not to blame for your child's lateness. Please speak to the office staff courteously, they are recording the late children on my request. Thank you to all the parents and carers who have been very supportive of this new initiative.
