On Thursday, Class 2A visited The Unicorn Theatre to see Anansi the Spider. 6M visited Horland's Farm to compare how land is used in the countryside in contrast with London to enrich their learning about their UK study. Today Year 5 visited The Royal Observatory where they learnt about 'The Universe on your Doorstep' These experiences will enable our pupils to consolidate and deepen their learning topic for the Autumn term.

Late coming procedure

I have been asked for clarification on procedures at the beginning of the school day.

The main school gates are opened at 8.30. Children are allowed to come into the playground from this time but are not allowed to run around as this would be unsafe when so many people are lining up.

All pupils are expected to be in the playground by 8.45 ready to line up. Reception and Nursery pupils are expected to be waiting by their gate. The bell is rung at 8.45 and all pupils are expected to line up and follow their teacher to class. Learning begins straight away in classes, therefore pupils arriving after classes have gone to their classrooms, will miss out.

I close the main gates by 8.50 to ensure all parents and carers have time to leave the premises and to ensure the premises is safe and secure for pupils and staff.

Pupils arriving after the gates have closed will need to be taken to the school office. It is important to be aware that the school office is particularly busy at this time and it may take staff some time to record the names of all the pupils going through. For safeguarding and legal reasons, they have to write names of all pupils, time of arrival and reason for lateness. These are then recorded on the digital attendance system.





















We understand that lateness can be unavoidable on a couple of occasions each year but should not happen on a regular basis. Please try to ensure that your child arrives in school **before** the bell each morning as this will help them to understand that school is important.

Harvest Festival

As a Right's Respecting School (RRS) we want to enhance understanding that all children have a right to nutritious food and a clean environment so they stay healthy (article 24 of the UNCRC).

13 million people live below the poverty line in the UK.

As part of our celebration for Harvest Festival this year, we will be collecting food for our local 'Helping Hands Foodbank' at St Peter's Church which provides emergency food to local people in crisis.

We will also be collecting for the **Manna Centre**, as usual. This is a centre which provides meals for homeless people in London each day. A large amount of their food each year comes from donations at Harvest Festival.

We will also be donating some items to families in need in our school community through our **School Food Bank**. This is always available to our families so please let us know if you would like to come and take some items to help you out when things are difficult. This is kept very private and we can find a quiet time for you to collect what you need.

Each class will be collecting one food type (listed below) which is of most benefit to these great causes. We are asking each child to bring one food item to add to their class collection.

Donations of food can be brought into school from next week and the RRS reps will organise the collections for their class. If you would like to make a donation of food, please pick items from the list below.

It will be really great to see you!!






















Message from the Friends
