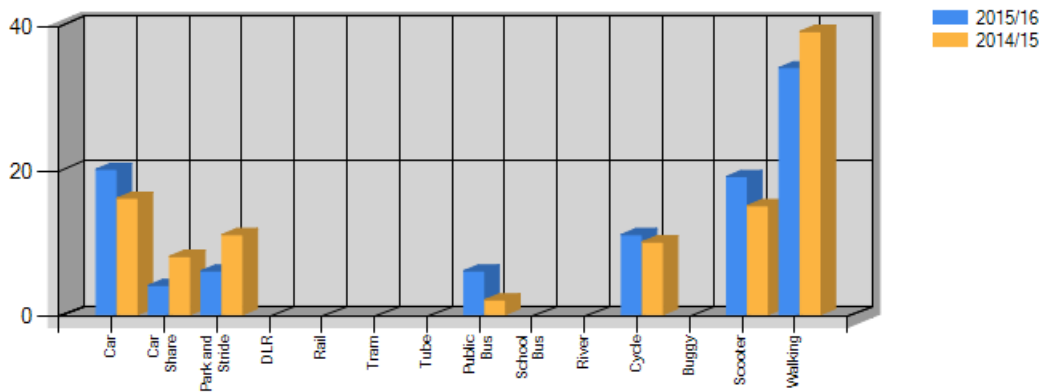

Commentary on results

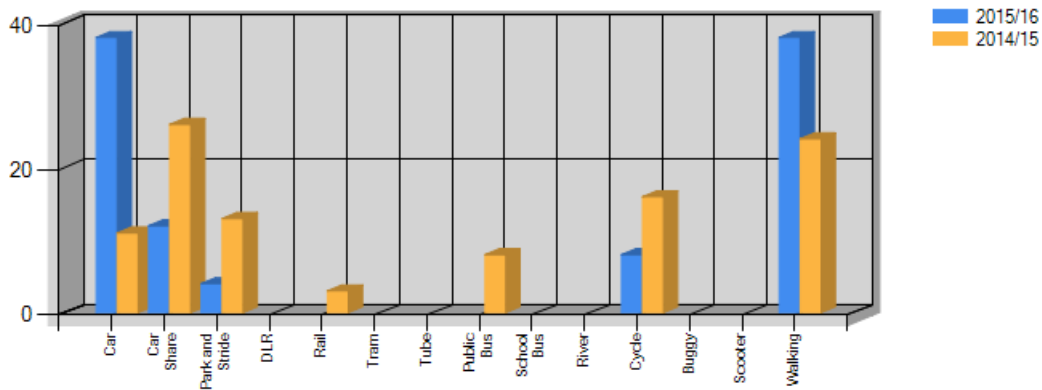
The increase in car use is due to the merging of the junior and infants as there are more students using the car in the juniors albeit slight, and an increase in scootering and cycling.

Commentary on results

There has been a slight increase in use of cars this year because of the need for teachers to work on both school sites which are a mile apart. Amalgamation on one site will solve this problem. The new parking zone has come in now. The staff now have to buy expensive permits. This does not take account of all staff as we cannot combine the data from both sites. There has in fact been a large increase in use of sustainable transport at the Effingham Road site.

All of our children are under 8 years of age and therefore are always accompanied by an adult. They and their parents have frequently expressed concerns about the dangers of the roads close to the school. They experience great difficulties crossing Manor lane in particular because there are no safe gaps due to parked cars and there is a constant flow of traffic at the beginning and end of the school day. The children suggested a zebra crossing but when I asked the council they said that it is not the right kind of road. I was advised by road safety to apply for a raised crossing . I have therefore put this in the issues section of this plan.
