Dear Parents and Carers,

We are racing through the term and the children are all working really hard. Thank you for your continued support in keeping our community safe.

A number of people have asked about whether they still need to wear face coverings at pick up and drop off and the answer is a definite yes. Staff and any visitors are still wearing face coverings in communal areas and all control measures are still fully in place in school.
