





# Beyond our Horizons - Year 1

## Summer 2 - 2022

### Literacy

- To discover, read and share a range of stories, poems and non-fiction texts related to the sea.
- To create longer narratives and imaginative stories inspired by key texts including *The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch* and *The Night Pirates*.
- To listen to, read and recite poems about the sea.
- To write our own poetry with a nautical theme.
- To look at word endings (suffixes) such as *helped*, *shorter*, *shortest*.
- To understand and use the prefix *un-* to change the meaning of words (eg. *unkind* or *untie*).
- To continue with Phase 5 letters and sounds. Learning alternative pronunciations of known graphemes (e.g. 'a' as in 'acorn') and alternative spelling of some phonemes (e.g. *chief*, *grow*, *pear*).
- To begin to join some letters in our writing.
- To continue Little Wandle group guided reading in class three times a week.
- Children should continue to read to an adult at home every day.



### Maths:

- **Number** - children will continue to represent, memorise and use addition facts and subtraction facts. Children will deepen their understanding of place value by partitioning representing, ordering and comparing all two-digit numbers.
- **Time** - children will measure, order and compare units of time. They will consolidate their skills of telling the time to half past.
- **Money** - we will recognise common coins and notes and order them by value. Children will solve problems involving adding and subtracting 1p, 2p, 5p and 10p coins.



### Science:

Weather and Seasonal change - children will observe and discuss changes across the seasons. Children will describe weather associated with the seasons and how day length varies. Children will be encouraged to ask questions, carry out simple tests and record their results.

## Religious Education:

Miracles - children will learn about the different miracles that Jesus performed. They will think of ways in which we can trust Jesus when in need. Children will begin to understand how compassion motivates people and reflect on how we can help one another.



## Geography & History: All at sea - oceans and continents

In geography we will learn to locate and name the major oceans and continents on the globe. We will learn about extreme forms of weather and climate in different parts of the world. In history we will be finding out about the lives of sailors from long ago. We will study the lives of famous pirates from the past. We will learn the story of Grace Darling and the Longstone Lighthouse. We will be learning all about the Cutty Sark and the Maritime History of Greenwich.



ICT: "We are celebrating" - children will create a digital greetings card. Children will develop basic skills using a keyboard and mouse. They will combine text and images to create a card.

Art / Design Technology: Seascapes and water colour. Exploring prints and patterns - children will use objects to print patterns and designs. They will make simple printing plates using polystyrene. Children will explore patterns and prints from different countries around the world. Children will design and build a model lighthouse.

## PE:

PE (Monday) - Athletics: developing running, jumping and throwing skills.

Dance (Wednesday) - with Wiggle: sea theme.

Music: Children will continue to experience a range of percussion instruments and learn about beat, pulse and rhythm.

PSHE: Journey in Love. Exploring how we are part of our own family and also the church's family. Then we will reflect on our time and experiences over the last year before looking forward to our next transition to Year 2.
